centage of voter turnout in the Commonwealth of Kentucky (68.2% in 2016; 47% in 2015; 63.2% in 2014) and the age group of 50-61 have the second highest percentage (65.6% in 2016; 39.3 in 2015; 56.5% in 2014) of voter turnout. In comparison, here are the voter turnout percentages for the age group 25-34. (46.6% in 2016; 16.6% in 2015; 28.6% in 2014)

BAD NEWS: Only two thirds will vote

Getting to the polls to vote is only a part of the problem as I see it. The more significant problem to me is what I hear way too often in conversations with voters. The voters are often deciding who to vote for based on party lines, be it Republican or Democrat, or on a candidate's stated position on a single issue instead of ex-

ploring their positions on the issues that will actually impact their daily lives. Let's use gun control for an example.

I often hear people say that they are voting for someone because that candidate has been endorsed by the NRA. The reality is that there has not been, nor is there likely to be, any serious effort by the Kentucky Legislature to take anyone's guns away. There may be an occasional bill introduced to ban assault weapons or increase the wait time to purchase a weapon, but these bills almost always never even get a hearing in committee. A look back at some of the gun related bills and resolutions from the 2018 Legislative Session is

A quick check of actually quite revealing:

- HB 498 ban assault weapons for Elections statistics those under age 21
- SR 172, HR 176 encourage/alfor the years 2016, low school teachers to carry weapons at
 - SB 162, HB 554, SB 103 arming
 - HB 315 allow attorneys to conceal and carry at all times in all places
 - HB 210 allow conceal and carry in postsecondary and state buildings
 - HB 36 making it possible to conceal and carry without a license

They are NOT coming after your guns, but they ARE coming after your pen-

As a matter of fact, they already have! I think most of you are familiar with the GOOD NEWS: You are more likely to saga of how the same legislators who are protecting your 2nd Amendment right hastily, underhandedly, and illegally passed SB 151, the "sewage bill," in the very last days of the session. As I am typing this the Governor has filed an appeal to ask the Kentucky Supreme Court to review the ruling by Franklin Circuit Judge Philip Shepherd that the General Assembly violated the Kentucky Constitution by passing SB 151 only six hours after it was introduced. The Governor is bypassing the Kentucky Court of Appeals by asking this case be sent directly to the state's highest court.

> Probably lesser known is how the Tax Reform and State Budget bills may directly affect your pocketbook.

> First, the tax reform bill reduced the amount of pension income exempt from state taxes by \$10,000, from \$41,110 to \$31,110. When you file your taxes next April you may find that this could cost you up to \$500 in state tax on that \$10,000 that was previously exempt.

care, "The 2018-2020 budget funds health coverage in a way that if repeated in future budgets would negatively impact retiree healthcare... The new 2018-2020 budget assigns costs for two pieces of retiree healthcare - one dealing with the premiums for the dependents of retired teachers and the other dealing with the premiums for under-65 retired teachers – to the TRS fund that covers Medicare Eligible Health Plan claims. Neither of those expenses were envisioned in 2010, when Shared Responsibility became law, as uses for the TRS fund... Using the TRS fund for the subsidy for the dependents of under-65 retirees is manageable in the short term; however, it's inconsistent with the 2010 Shared Responsibility solution and unsustainable in the long term."

This budget shortfall will quite possibly be felt by those under-65 retirees who have dependent coverage as soon as 2019 when they may have to pick up at least a portion of this dependent coverage in both 2019 and 2020. Unless this funding is restored it is very doubtful this benefit can be retained.

So, what's the plan?

- VOTE!
- Do not be a single issue voter!
- Get to know your candidates. Find out exactly where they stand on issues that are going to have direct and immediate impact on you (tax and pension reform, retiree health care, the state budget...)
- Look at the candidates' voting record on those issues that impact you.
- Educate our younger voters on the importance of being an educated voter!
- Help get our younger folks registered to vote.
- Help get our younger voters to the polls.

Nominations for the 2019 KEA-Retired delegates to the KEA Delegate Assembly and NEA Representative Assembly must be submitted to KEA headquarters by October 5

The KEA Delegate Assembly will be held April 3 – 5, 2019 at Louisville Marriott Downtown. KEA-Retired may have as many as 105 delegates to the assembly. (The exact number will be known when membership is verified on November 15, 2018).

If you wish to serve as a KEA-Retired delegate to the KEA DA, fill out the nomination form on page 5 and return it to Kathy Whitlock, KEA-Retired Associate Staff. Nominations must be postmarked no later than October 5, 2018.

KEA-Retired Delegates to the Delegate Assembly will receive up to \$300 plus mileage (currently at .545 cents per mile). Receipts are needed for every expense. Delegates must attend all sessions.

Nominations are also open for delegates to the NEA Representative Assembly. The NEA RA will be held in Houston, TX, July 2 – July 7, 2019. Delegates are also expected to attend the NEA Retired Annual Meeting which will be held in Houston immediately prior to the NEA RA. KEA-Retired may have as many as 16 delegates to the NEA RA. (The KEA-Retired President is an automatic delegate).



If you wish to serve as a KEA-Retired delegate to the NEA RA, fill out the nomination form on page 5 and return it (postmarked no later than October 5, 2018) to Kathy Whitlock, KEA-Retired Associate Staff.

KEA-Retired delegates to the NEA RA will receive up to \$1675 toward expenses for attending the NEA RA and up to \$700 toward expenses for attending the NEA-Retired Annual Meeting. Receipts are required for all expenses incurred during the meetings. A written report is required with the expense voucher.

Participants are expected to attend all sessions of the NEA-Retired Annual Meeting, all sessions of the NEA RA and any caucuses held by the Kentucky delegation.

KEA Political Mission

As part of our political mission, KEA strongly supports a viable two-party system in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. As the political arm of KEA, KEPAC has one expressed political priority which is to help elect qualified candidates to Kentucky's Constitutional and State Legislative offices, regardless of political affiliation, who demonstrate not only with words but also with their leadership and votes, support of public education.

KEPAC is the political voice of the members of Kentucky Education Association. This is an important note because KEA cannot endorse candidates. As a Political Action Committee, or PAC, KEPAC can and does make such endorsements.

And does our endorsement carry a lot of weight! As the largest PAC in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, KEPAC takes great pride in the work that members engage in at the local, Senate territory, and state levels, to ensure that there is a thorough vetting of each candidate before a recommendation, and ultimately, an endorsement is made.

The endorsement process for the 2018 Legislative elections began on January 30, which was the last day a candidate could file to run in the May primary. The Saturday following that deadline, the KEPAC state committee met to review endorsements of incumbent legislators.

Per KEPAC guidelines, incumbent endorsements are awarded when the incumbent has "demonstrated consistent support by evaluation of the KEA legislative objectives" and shall be recommended by the "appropriate campaigns and elections committee."

KEA has built strong relationships with Democrats and Republicans in the legislature. These relationships have been essential in achieving key components of our legislative objectives and KEPAC took those relationships, statements, and votes into consideration when awarding incumbent endorsements through both the primary and general elections.

Per the endorsement guidelines, any legislative candidate who is not an incumbent is responsible for completing the KEPAC written questionnaire and may then be interviewed by a local committee of stakeholders within the appropriate legislative district. The local committee may elect to recommend a candidate for endorsement or decline to make a recommendation.

Recommendations for endorsement are evaluated by the state KEPAC committee and the committee has the sole discretion to endorse or decline to endorse a recommended candidate.

The state KEPAC committee met in early February to consider endorsements for incumbent candidates and then in June and July to consider endorsements for non-incumbent candidates. The committee will meet again in August to consider the final round of recommendations for endorsements.

The candidates endorsed, both Democrats and Republicans, have either demonstrated as incumbents, or illustrated through the questionnaire and interview process, their commitment to public education in our Commonwealth. The only issues the KEPAC committee considers when reviewing recommendations at the local level, or endorsements at the state committee level, are issues concerning public education.

Of the incumbent and non-incumbent candidates endorsed by KEPAC for the May 2018 primary, 95% of those candidates with an endorsement won and will advance to the general election. One of the most powerful primary endorsements, that of high school math teacher R. Travis Brenda over House Majority Floor Leader Jonathan Shell in the 71st district, resulted in Shell being defeated by 123 votes.

KEPAC is proud to have a bi-partisan committee and to have endorsed candidates on both sides of the political aisle, candidates who speak for the communities in which they hope to represent in the legislature.
