The end of school is here or nearly here for many of you. To keep up to date on what's happening in Frankfort, please keep up with KEA on our social media pages for information related to any news of a *possible* special legislative session around university and quasi-agency pensions.

The Public Pension Oversight Board (PPOB) met on Monday for its regular meeting. The presentation by KERS Executive Director David Eager, offered up information about the bill vetoed by the Governor, the Governor's new proposal and other alternatives legislators brought forth to address the dire funding needs of KERS- NH employees. There was no discussion of teacher or other school employee pensions.

KDE Offers Summer Help for Reading and Math Regression

The Kentucky Department of Education wants to help families help their children fight summer reading and math regression. This "**Stride, Don't Slide flyer**" lists resources families can use this summer to help their children make strides while school is not in session. <u>Get the flyer here</u>.
