Dear Member:

As we begin this week, students and educators across the Commonwealth are dealing with major upheavals and uncertainties in their daily routines. The COVID-19 pandemic is impacting all aspects of our lives. Ensuring the health and safety of our students, educators, and their families is of utmost importance during these times. KEA is actively working with legislators, the Kentucky Department of Education, and other education groups to provide flexibility and relief for schools and educators as we move on with the remainder of this academic year.

We understand that the NTI and other out-of-school plans vary greatly from district to district. We are asking educators to remain calm, identify concerns, proactively look for solutions, and be flexible as we all find equitable solutions that ensure students receive the services and instruction they need. This must be done, however, while also providing all school employees a safe and flexible work environment. We applaud the governor's proactive stance during this pandemic and ask that every school district superintendent, administrator, and board of education follow Govornor Beshear's and the Kentucky Department of Education's recommendations related to schools and employee safety.

2020 KEA Delegate Assembly and KEA Scheduled Events

The KEA Board of Directors met virtually on Sunday, March 15th for the purpose of discussing the 2020 KEA Delegate Assembly and other KEA scheduled events. The KEA Board of Directors unanimously voted to cancel the 2020 Delegate Assembly which was scheduled for April 1-3 at the Louisville Downtown Marriott.

KEA Delegate Assembly delegates will receive an email today with details and instructions on cancelling of room reservations and other activities. As an organization that supports education professionals, the KEA Board believes we should lead by example to ensure the safety and health of members, delegates and staff.

The KEA Board has **not set a future date** for the 2020 KEA Delegate Assembly, but we will work to schedule a convening of the delegates prior to August 31st if at all possible. Depending on how the current COVID-19 events unfold, we

may have to consider holding the Delegate Assembly through some virtual or semi-virtual platform in lieu of an in-person meeting. The KEA Board will convene in the near future to determine a possible time, date, and type of meeting. In addition to cancelling the DA, the board voted to cancel all KEA-sponsored, in-person events through the end of April and recommends that KEA governance district leadership and local leadership follow suit. #TeamKentucky #TogetherKY

Floor Amendment

Retain original provisions except increase the emergency nontraditional instruction days to 30; provide exemption from adding time to the instructional day due to logistical hardships; provide 30 emergency leave days for staff due to the COVID-19 public health emergency; direct the Kentucky Department of Education to seek federal waivers regarding school meal service rules in

Using census data, each year the federal government allocates tens of billions of dollars in education funds to states and localities using formulas that factor in population and poverty levels. An accurate census count is the critical first step to helping educators address the needs of every child who walks through their doors. The census count happens only once every 10 years; when we under count young children, the consequences can last most of their childhood.
