Senate Bill 10 - This bill was heard and voted on during the Senate Education Committee this week. SB 10 would reorganize the Kentucky State Board of Education once again. It is time we stop playing politics with the state board. The current Board of Education is comprised of highly qualified education professionals who know and understand what our students, educators and public schools need to be successful. Political party affiliation should not be considered when making appointments to the state board; professional or significant policy experience in public education is all that should matter. House of Representatives Unveils Kentucky's Budget

On Thursday and Friday, the House of Representatives filed and passed <u>HB352</u>, their version of the 2020 - 2022 Biennium Budget. Although different from the budget proposed by Governor Beshear, this budget does start to change the direction of investments in our public schools. This is the second step in the budget process. The budget will now move to the Senate, which can make any changes to the House bill it deems appropriate. Both chambers will eventually have to agree on a single version of the bill. KEA will be monitoring the budget process as it moves through the Senate and will update members as information becomes available.

House Proposed Budget Includes:

- **SEEK Base funding** increase \$4061 1st year of the budget; \$4112 2nd year of the budget
- \$18.7 million in school building upgrades mandated by Senate Bill 1 (2019) (9.35 million each year of the budget)
- Funding for counselors 14.8 million in the 1st year;
 23.7 in the 2nd year
- 1% Pay increase each year for all certified and classified school employees (added to SEEK)
- \$10 million in funding for textbooks (\$5 million each vear)
- Full funding for the Teachers' Retirement System
- Full funding for the Kentucky Employee Retirement System
- 61.4 million for pre-65 retiree health insurance coverage first year only; NO funding for 2nd year of the biennium for pre-65 retiree health insurance coverage
- Does NOT restore the funding that was removed from the current budget for health insurance subsidies for retirees' dependents
- No Funding for Educator Professional Learning
- No Funding for KTIP, KPIP or mentorships

The 2020 Census officially begins this week. The U.S. Census is vitally important to the well-being of children and the strength of their public schools. Using census data, each year the federal government allocates tens of billions of dollars in education funds to states and localities using formulas that factor in population and poverty levels. An accurate census count is the critical first step to helping educators address the needs of every child who walks through their doors. The census count happens only once every 10 years; when we undercount young children, the consequences can last most of their childhood.
