

## **Diversity Lesson Plan Contest Rubric**

## Total 100 points possible:

- I. <u>Context</u> (20 points total; 5 points for each subsection)
  - A. Describe your class demographics, i.e., the total number of students, male/female student ratio, ethnicities, G.T., Special Education, grade level, etc.
  - B. Describe the students' prior knowledge or focus of previous lesson
  - C. Describe any modifications if necessary
  - D. Describe the purpose of the lesson as it relates to diversity
- II. <u>Success Criteria/Objectives</u> (20 points total; 5 points for each subsection)
  - A. State what students will demonstrate as a result of this lesson. i.e. your learning intention
  - B. Objective must be student centered, i.e., "I will be successful in . . . " "Students will..." "I can..."
  - C. Instructional strategies
  - D. List all Kentucky Core Academic Standard(s) being addressed in the lesson; Please include written language of the targeted standard(s)
- III. <u>Impact on the awareness of diversity on lesson plan</u> (25 points total; 5 points for subsection A; 10 points each for subsections B and C)
  - A. Why was this lesson important to you personally?
  - B. How did this lesson enhance your students' awareness of diversity?
  - C. Why was this lesson important to your school community?
- IV. <u>List of resources needed to teach the lesson</u> (5 pts)
- V. <u>Assessment</u> (10 points): Briefly describe the assessment you used for this lesson (i.e., formative, summative, performance). Please provide a copy of the assessment or rubric used.
- VI. <u>Reflections</u> (10 points; 4 points for subsection A; 3 points each for subsections B and C): After delivering your unit/lesson, reflect on its success:
  - A. What evidence, qualitative, or quantitative data demonstrates that students met goals and objectives?
  - B. In what areas did students exceed goals and objectives?
  - C. What might you do differently next time?
- VII. <u>Student artifacts/evidence (10 pts.)</u> Provide a maximum of 3 examples of students work/evidence (no student photos)
